The Hoedspruit Endangered Species Centre (HESC) established Rescued Rhinos @ HESC to treat and care for victims of poaching (including mutilated survivors and orphaned rhino calves) in an effort to increase survival rates. Their approach, based on conservation and environmental management policies, includes the animals' rehabilitation and release back into the wild. The programme supports relevant research on how to deal with the wounds inflicted during poaching as well as the care required to improve the rhino's chance of survival. It also goes hand-in-hand with educating learners, students and the public to protect and care for this threatened iconic (and irreplaceable) species.

Our mission: With these objectives in mind, HESC launched the 'Eyes on Rhinos' campaign in an effort to raise funds to acquire, install and manage a security system needed to protect the rhinos in their care from further abuse. The Board of Trustees of the "Wildlife Conservation Trust" manages and oversees the application of funds received for this purpose.
